When should I call my doctor?

- If I am worried, my doctor is worried! I will call my doctor's office.
- If I have signs of an infection, like a fever above 101.5 degrees or redness and swelling around my incisions, I will call my doctor.
- If I am short of breath, have pain, swelling or cramping in my legs or have chest pain with no activity, I will call my doctor's office.

What should I expect after surgery?

- It is normal to have some draining and bleeding from my nose.
- I will have some swelling and bruising on my face and nose.
- I may have black eyes for a couple of weeks.

When will I see my doctor?

- I need to have a follow-up appointment with my doctor in 1 week after surgery.

What about my pain?

- I will have some discomfort.
- I will use ice on my face and nose to help my swelling and pain.
- I may use over the counter Ibuprofen or Tylenol.
 - I may be given a prescription for narcotic pain medication if Ibuprofen and Tylenol is not enough.
 - I will not take extra Tylenol if I am taking Norco, Lortab or Percocet because they have Tylenol in it.
 - I will not drive if I am taking narcotic pain medication.
 - Narcotic pain medication may cause constipation. I will drink extra fluids and I may need a stool softener.
- I will follow pain medication instructions given by my nurse or pharmacist.

How do I care for my surgical site?

- The morning after surgery, I may use over the counter nasal saline, like Ocean Spray, 3 times per day for 2-3 days to soften crusting in my nose.
- I can use over the counter Afrin nasal spray for congestion or bleeding.
- If I have an incision under my nose, I may apply antibiotic ointment (i.e. Bacitracin) or Vaseline 2 -3 times a day.
- My stitches are absorbable and do not need to be removed.
- If I have splints in my nose, they will be removed in the office when I see my doctor.

What about activity?

- I will NOT bend, lift, or strain for 1 week.
- I may blow my nose gently if I need to.
- I will sleep with my head elevated on pillows or in a recliner for 2 - 3 days after surgery.
- If I need to cough or sneeze, I will be sure my mouth is open.
 - I will not try to hold back a cough or sneeze. This may lead to a bad nose bleed.
