When should I call my doctor?

- If I am worried, my doctor is worried! I will call my doctor's office.
- I will call my doctor if I have a fever above 101.5 degrees.
- If I am short of breath or have chest pain with no activity, I will call my doctor's office.

What should I expect after surgery?

- I will have a sore throat for several days after surgery.
- · I will have a small amount of blood in my spit for a few days.

When will I see my doctor?

• I need to have a follow-up appointment with my doctor in 2-3 weeks after surgery.

What about my pain?

- · I will have some discomfort.
- I may take over the counter ibuprofen.
- I may take over the counter Tylenol if I am NOT taking Norco, Lortab or Percocet because they have Tylenol in it.
- I have been given a prescription for narcotic pain medication.
 - I will call my doctor if I have nausea or vomiting with this medicine.
 - · I will not take extra Tylenol if I am taking Norco, Lortab or Percocet because they have Tylenol in it.
 - I will not drive if I am taking narcotic pain medication.
 - Narcotic pain medication may cause constipation. I will drink extra fluids and I may need a stool softener.
- I may be given Tetracaine lollipops to help numb my throat.
- I can take over the counter Ibuprofen or prescribed Meloxicam for pain.
- · I will follow pain medication instructions given by my nurse or pharmacist.

What can I eat?

- I will have liquids for the first day after surgery. Milkshakes and yogurt are ok.
- · Starting the day after surgery I can eat soft things like mashed potatoes, noodles and ground meat.
- Three days after surgery I can begin to eat whatever feels comfortable to me.
